



PubMed® is a free database supporting the search and retrieval of biomedical and life sciences literature. It is the most heavily used biomedical literature database in the world.

PubMed comprises more than 33 million citations for biomedical literature from MEDLINE, life science journals, and online books. Citations may include links to full-text content from PubMed Central (PMC) and publisher websites.

PubMed covers a variety of health topics, including environmental health, social sciences, microbiology, genetics, and chemical and physical sciences.





Features of PubMed:



- Search and refine your results
 - Bring relevant results to the top with Best Match
 - Find specific citations with a citation sensor
 - Narrow your results with filters
 - Link to similar articles
 - Search by field, combine searches, see the search details, and download your search history with Advanced Search
 - Apply specialized filters for clinical queries



- Save and share your results
 - Email results to yourself or a colleague
 - Share quickly to social media
 - Copy the citation in several popular formats
 - Download results for use with spreadsheets or citation managers
 - Add items to a temporary clipboard while you work



- Find links to full-text articles in PubMed Central (PMC) and literature [or books] in the National Center for Biotechnology Information's (NCBI's) Bookshelf
- Access additional resources through NCBI LinkOut program: full-text articles, biological databases, consumer health information, research tools, and much more
